Cascina Val del Prete Vino Bianco "Bizzarro"

Overview

- Bizzarro is Cascina Val del Prete's most experimental release — the product of Giovanni Roagna's curiosity meeting his father Mario's deep respect for tradition. Made from Arneis, the native Roero white grape that nearly disappeared entirely by the 1960s, Bizzarro treats the variety unconventionally: extended skin contact and barrel fermentation give it more in common with orange wine than with a classic, stainless-steel Roero Arneis. The name says it all — "bizarre," and proud of it.

Appellation: Vino Bianco

Type: White, dry

Varietal: 100% Arneis

Winemaking and Vineyard Notes

Production Zone: Priocca, Cuneo.

Vineyard: The Luët vineyard extends for 3.7 acres. The vineyard is bio-dynamically fertilized.

Soil: Clayey with sandy veins, alkaline pH

Elevation: 250 meters (820 feet) a.s.l.

Exposure: East and west.

Vine age: 25+ years old.

Density: 5,000 vines per hectare.

Training System: Vertical trellised.

Pruning: Guyot

Tasting Notes

Color: Strawberry-gold with slight amber reflections; medium lemon-green in youth, deepening with age.

Bouquet: Pronounced and elegant — pear, ripe apricot, white flowers, and sweet baking spice.

Palate: Medium-bodied and smooth, with notable length and a lightly spiced, pleasant finish. Textured from extended lees contact and barrel fermentation.

Serving Temperature: 12-13° C (53-55° F).

Food Pairing

Pairs well with shellfish, lean fish, cured meats, and mature or hard cheeses — versatile enough to handle both delicate and assertive dishes.



Cascina Val del Prete is a certified organic, biodynamically-farmed estate in Priocca, in Piedmont's understated Roero appellation. Founded in 1977 by Bartolomeo and Carolina Roagna, the family farm—now led by son Mario and grandson Giovanni—cultivates native varieties Arneis, Barbera, and Nebbiolo across a stunning natural amphitheater of vines. Non-interventionist winemaking, indigenous yeast fermentations, and minimal manipulation define their approach, from classic Roero reds to the excellent Arneis. Two generations, two philosophies—tradition and experimentation—fuse into exceptional wines truly of place.
