Zuani

Collio Bianco "Vigne"

Overview

- Zuani's base white comes from the same source as the estate's Riserva — Friulano, Chardonnay, Sauvignon, and Pinot Grigio grown together on the Giasbana hillside above San Floriano del Collio, on ponca, the region's ancient marl and sandstone. Hand-harvested by variety in small boxes around the third week of September, the grapes are cold-macerated and fermented separately in temperature-controlled steel, with no oak at any stage, then rest three months in bottle before release.

Appellation: Collio Bianco DOC

Varietals: Tocai Friulano, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, and Pinot Grigio

Type: White, dry

Winemaking and Vineyard Notes

Production Area: Zuani, Giasbana, in the municipality of San Floriano del Collio (GO).

Vineyard: Southwestern exposure, with a medium to steep slope.

Altitude: 800 to 900 feet a.s.l.

Average age of vines: 15 to 30 years old. Plant density: 1300 plants per acre.

Training System: Double Pergola.

Soil: Marl and sandstone of mid-oceanic origin.

Harvest: Harvested around the third week of September.

Yield: About 3.2 tons per acre.

Vinification: Each varietal is vinified separately; cold maceration; temperature-controlled fermentation and maturing in stainless steel tank.

Aging: In the bottle for 3 months.

Tasting Notes

Color: Bright, light golden.

Bouquet: Soft, complex, fruit-rich nose enhanced by lingering mineral notes.

Palate: The warm, broad palate echoes the nose, revealing balanced acidity and impressively rich fruit on the long finish.

Food Pairing

Delicious with light starters, baked rice or pasta, fish and white meat.



Patrizia Felluga founded **Zuani** in 2001 on the Giasbana hillside above San Floriano del Collio, meters from the Slovenian border, with a singular idea: one wine, a pure expression of the Collio. The fifth generation of a storied Friulian winemaking family, she built the estate on ponca, the region's distinctive marl and sandstone, planting Friulano, Chardonnay, Sauvignon, and Pinot Grigio to be harvested separately and blended, never bottled alone. Today she works alongside her children, Antonio and Caterina, producing a small range of structured, age-worthy whites, led by the oak-aged Zuani Riserva.
